

O saving God, who led your people through the wilderness and brought them to the promised land: so guide us that, following our Saviour, we may walk through the wilderness of this world and be brought to the glory of the world which is to come; through your Son, Jesus Christ our Lord, who lives and reigns with you and the Holy Spirit, one God, now and for ever. Amen.



reading from the Letter of Paul to the Romans, Chapter 10, Verses 4-13

For Christ is the end of the law so that there may be righteousness for everyone who believes.

Moses writes concerning the righteousness that comes from the law, that 'the person who does these things will live by them.' But the righteousness that comes from faith says, 'Do not say in your heart, "Who will ascend into heaven?"' (that is, to bring Christ down) 'or "Who will descend into the abyss?"' (that is, to bring Christ up from the dead). But what does it say?

'The word is near you, on your lips and in your heart'

(that is, the word of faith that we proclaim); because if you confess with your lips that Jesus is Lord and believe in your heart that God raised him from the dead, you will be saved. For one believes with the heart and so is justified, and one confesses with the mouth and so is saved. The scripture says, 'No one who believes in him will be put to shame.' For there is no distinction between Jew and Greek; the same Lord is Lord of all and is generous to all who call on him. For, 'Everyone who calls on the name of the Lord shall be saved.'

Those who dwell in the shelter of the Most High: who abide under the shadow of the Almighty,

When the devil had finished every test, he departed from him until an
opportune time.

Then Jesus, filled with the power of the Spirit, returned to Galilee, and a report about him spread through all the surrounding country. He began to teach in their synagogues and was praised by everyone.

Message from Rev'd Roxanne

Dear Friends,

It's good to be back among you after three busy weeks away. Leon and I enjoyed walking the Aussie Camino very much. It's a walk from Portland to Penola that celebrates the life and ministry of St Mary Mackillop, Australia's only saint, who founded the Josephites, an Australian Order of missionary nuns. You might recall they have mission in Lima that we heard about last year. We were blessed with good weather, days in the mid-twenties for the most part, which is great for long distance walking, usually 20+ kilometres each day. Every day the terrain changed, from beach walking to cliff top walking, coastal bushland and open grassland. We climbed Mount Schank, a dormant volcano, and visited the Blue Lake in Mount Gambier. The wildlife was plentiful with sightings of koalas, seals, kangaroos and wallabies, and even an echidna with so many birds to see and hear. I always find that walking with God, in God's creation, is such a healing process. I've had six weeks of good health, the healthiest stretch in six months. Praise God! We're already thinking about another Camino next year!

So here we are in Lent. I love Lent. It's a time when I personally reboot my prayer life and practice a level of abstinence that is not usually part of my normal life. Most mornings, Leon and I are saying morning prayer together. We use the e-pray app (Australian Prayer Book) on our phones. You can download the app from your phone's app store. Details overleaf.

It's not too late to join one of our Lenten programs. We had our first Ripple Effect session on Thursday and the theme was "listen and share" using the story of the Samaritan Woman at the well with Jesus. It was inspiring and the study guide is available in the Narthex. Let us know if you would like to join us at 3:30pm on a Thursday afternoon. Being With starts on Saturday at 4pm, also at Holy Trinity in the church. This is a pathway program and very good for people seeking to know more about faith. I do encourage you to join so that you can confidently refer to it in the future.

This Sunday, we welcome Revd Nay Htoo and his family as they start a Sunday morning ministry with us. Please pray for Nay Htoo and all of us as we get to know each other and make a journey together over the next two years.
